OBITUARY

Bishop Gwendolyn Price Mack was born December 25, 1949 in Los Angeles, CA to Mrs. Ira Taylor Brown and Mr. Prothrow Price. She was their only child and quite a surprise for the older parents. She was educated and graduated from the Los Angeles Unified School District.

Bishop Mack accepted Christ at an early age and attended St. Reed Missionary Baptist Church in Los Angeles, CA. In 1968, Bishop Mack married Mr. Jesse Charles Daniels, Jr. and to this union two daughters were born. As a young wife and mother she attended Mount Moriah Missionary Baptist Church in Los Angeles, CA and the Greater New Bethel Church in Inglewood, CA.

Hearing God's call to preach the Gospel Message, she set out to find a spiritual home where she could learn, develop and exercise her gift. She served and was mentored by Mother Dorthea Evans of Refuge Christian Center in Pasadena, CA. After years of faithful service, she was led to the Mount Zion Apostolic Church under the leadership of the late District Elder Ralph Lewis in Los Angeles, CA. She lovingly called First Apostolic Church of Inglewood under the leadership of the late Bishop Wayne Sylvester Davis home. It was at First Apostolic where she grew as an evangelist, served as an intercessory prayer warrior, and lead praise and worship.

Bishop Mack moved from Los Angeles to Houston, TX in 1991 and later married Elder Henry Mack in October of 1999.

In 1991, Bishop Mack founded the Tabernacle of Praise Church in Richmond,

TX. The church thrived under her leadership and produced lasting fruit. The church always operated in excellence. The ministry's conferences such as W.H.I.P to W.A.I.T. blessed and delivered many.

Bishop Mack became a member of the New Day Kingdom Assembly of Churches in 2009 under the leadership of Archbishop Thomas E. Wallace, Founder and Presiding Prelate. As a member of New Day, Bishop Mack served at the state and regional levels until her health failed. In 2012, Bishop Mack united with the New Oasis Kingdom Assembly Church under the pastoral leadership of Archbishop Thomas E. Wallace and served there faithfully.

On Wednesday, August 3, 2016, the Lord called this faithful servant home to take her rest.

She leaves to cherish her memory her husband, Elder Henry Mack, her children, Lisa Nichelle Alexander and Jessica Nicole Daniels and one son-in-law, Elgin M. Alexander.
